Today, no sailor sets off on a trip at sea without maps and a 1..... But long before Europeans began to explore the world's oceans, Polynesian sailors had successfully landed on every island in the Pacific, without any such instruments.

In New Zealand's North Island, people are bringing back the 2..... Polynesian science of "way-finding". It's a method of navigation that uses the stars, the Sun, and ocean movement to sail across the vast waters of the Pacific.

Some teachers at the University of Waikato, near Auckland, are passing the knowledge of "way-finding" on to the younger generation.

As with any navigation technique, the most 3..... piece of equipment you need is a compass. But these young people are learning to find a location in the ancient way, which uses the stars rather than the Earth's magnetic field for navigation.

This is how it works: before night ends, the navigator finds his position from the stars. Then he memorises the way the canoe moves as it travels over the ocean towards his 4..... That is because during the day the Sun moves, so you can't use it to find your way. All you can rely on is the ocean movement. So, the navigator keeps the canoe travelling in the same ocean movement and stays on course until the stars come out again.

There's nothing like having your own charity to work for, but Leonardo DiCaprio supports much more than his own non-profit foundation. For example, he worked with orphans while on the set of his movie 'Blood Diamond'.

Leonardo DiCaprio has contributed a lot to environmental charities. He even encouraged other celebrities to arrive at the 2007 Oscars in 'green' vehicles. Leonardo has also made a documentary on global warming called 'The 11th Hour'.

As a dedicated environmentalist, DiCaprio has received congratulations from various environmental groups for his good deeds. In the past, he has chosen to travel on commercial flights instead of using a private plane. It is also reported that he drives a 'green' car and has a house that does not pollute the environment. In an interview about his 2007 film, 'The 11th Hour', DiCaprio said that global warming was "the number-one environmental problem".

The list of Leonardo's activities for charity goes on.

- In 2010, he earned an award for his environmental work from 'Do Something', an organisation that is dedicated to helping people who do good and inspiring young people to follow their example.
- In 1998, DiCaprio and his mother gave \$35,000 for a modern "Leonardo DiCaprio Computer Center" at the Los Feliz Library in Los Angeles, close to Leonardo's childhood home. It was rebuilt after the 1994 Northridge earthquake, and opened again in early 1999.
- While filming 'Blood Diamond' in 2005, DiCaprio worked with 24 orphaned children from Maputo, Mozambique.
- Most recently, in 2010, he donated \$1,000,000 to rescue efforts in Haiti after the earthquake.

Kids and Green Vegetables



Poppy: I find it really hard to get my kids to eat their green vegetables. I am constantly experimenting with new ways to dress them up and make them look tastier. What's the best way you have found to solve this problem?

Jamie: Actually, there are two ways of dealing with this. Firstly, when I had to cook for 1,700 schoolkids who didn't want to eat vegetables, I used to make a 13-veg tomato sauce that went in their pizzas, sauces and soups, and they ate it all up even though they said they hated what I'd hidden. A rare mammal has been found 100 years after people thought the species had died out.

Sibree's lemur was thought to be extinct. Scientists recently rediscovered the creature in Madagascar.

Scientists exploring the wildlife of Madagascar, an island-nation off the east coast of Africa, had a wonderful surprise recently. They announced that Sibree's lemur (lee-mer), which was thought to be extinct, was alive and well. This lemur, a type of mammal, and a relative of the chimpanzee, is only found in Madagascar and some nearby islands.



The discovery didn't happen overnight but took some time to be revealed. A few years ago, Mitchell Irwin, a scientist from McGill University, in Montreal, Canada, was exploring animal habitats in Madagascar. While he and his team were walking around the island's remoter regions, they came upon some tiny lemurs that looked a little bit different from other small lemurs they had seen. Irwin caught two of them and tested their DNA. The tests have shown that the lemurs are an indigenous species that were thought to have died out 100 years ago, when the animal's forest home was cut down to make way for development.

"If the discovery of Sibree's lemur hadn't been made, this species would probably have become extinct in the near future," Irwin reported. "Protecting its only known population and finding out how many individuals are left are now our main goals, especially since much of this region's forests have already been destroyed."

What are legends?



Legends are stories about people and their actions or deeds. These people actually lived and are mentioned in history. The stories are told for a reason and are based on facts,

but they are not completely true. Either the person never really did what the story says, or the historical events were changed. The aim of those who told the stories was to make them more interesting or meaningful, or to teach a lesson, like knowing right from wrong. Examples of people in English legends are King Arthur and Robin Hood.

A man who may have been King Arthur is known to have lived in the 5th or 6th century. But the stories about the Knights of the Round Table and Merlin the Magician may not be true. The point of the stories was that the knights and their king defended their people and helped them.

Indeed, it has been passed down through generations and still remains popular today.

It may describe a basketball player, football player or runner as a "sporting legend", or an actor as a "film legend". What is meant is that a person is famous because of their skills or achievements.

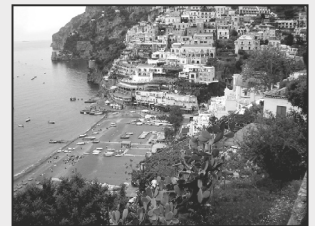

Sat-nav sends Swedish tourists to wrong end of Italy after Capri spelling mistake



1. A Swedish couple looking for the golden beaches of the Italian island of Capri were disappointed when their GPS navigation system led them 400 miles in the wrong direction, taking them instead to the industrial town of Carpi.

2. The middle-aged couple, who were not identified, only found out their error - the result of a tiny spelling mistake - when they asked staff in the local tourist office on Saturday how to drive to the island's famous "Blue Grotto".
